## BRONZE ARTS AWARD



Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is designed for ages 11-14, but is open to young people aged 11 to 25.

To achieve a Silver Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual arts log. We supply a logbook that can be used - as well as guidance on the option of establishing an online log through Arts Award Voice. A personally designed logbook/portfolio can be used. In this option, the sections of the award must be clearly identified and identifiable as the learning and activity against each criteria must be clear.

40 guided learning hours<u>20 independent learning hours</u>60 hours total qualification time

There are 4 distinct parts to the award :

- Exploring the arts as a participant
- Exploring the arts as an audience member
- Arts Inspiration
- Arts Skills Share

Additionally, the Advisor assesses candidates on:

- art form knowledge and understanding,
- creativity and
- communication.







### SILVER ARTS AWARD



Silver Arts Award is a Level 2 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is designed for ages 14 and above, but is open to young people aged 11 to 25. A GCSE is also a Level 2 qualification.

To achieve a Silver Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual arts portfolio of their experiences of:

### Arts practice and pathways

- identifying and planning an arts challenge
- implementing and reviewing their arts challenge
- reviewing arts events/experiences and sharing their views
- researching future opportunities and careers in the arts

### <u>Arts leadership</u>

- identifying a leadership role and planning a leadership project
- planning the practical issues
- being an effective arts leader
- working effectively with others
- reviewing their project and the development of their leadership skills



# SILVER ARTS AWARD



60 guided learning hours <u>35 independent learning hours</u> 95 hours total qualification time

There are 9 distinct parts to the award across two Units:

Arts Practice and Pathways

- Identify and Plan an Arts Challenge
- Implement and review the arts challenge
- Review Arts Events/experiences
- Undertake Arts Research

Arts Leadership

- Identify leadership role and plan the project's aims
- Plan the practical issues
- Effective Arts leadership
- Working Effectively with others
- Review the project & development of leadership skills

Additionally, the Advisor assesses candidates on art form knowledge and understanding, creativity, planning and review, and communication.





## SILVER ARTS AWARD



The following distinctive activities are required to support a young person to achieve the Silver Arts Award.

- 1. Coordinating a learning programme
- 2. Providing guided learning
- 3. Reviewing and Advising the candidate as they develop their portfolios
- 4. Assessing the portfolio
- 5. Coordinating certification

Activity area 2 may be provided by West, her Significant Seams colleagues, OR a wide range of arts provisions that West can help to coordinate. As an Arts Award Centre we want to help young people find the right arts context for them.

We look forward to hearing about the needs and ambitions of potential candidates and can provide a personalised proposal with relevant costs for private or ECHP funding.
